

## OVERVIEW

The average computer user has a multitude of accounts and passwords, which are not only a burden to keep track of, but are also a security concern for IT professionals. EMS Integrated Authentication addresses both issues by providing single sign-on for the web version of the EMS client, Virtual EMS™ or EMS Master Calendar based on centralized authentication via your network or web portal. Once users log in to the network or portal, they get secure access to EMS simply by double-clicking the EMS icon; no entry of a User ID or password is required.


There are two Integrated Authentication options:

### Portal Authentication

With Portal Authentication, once users are authenticated by their network or portal (e.g. SiteMinder, PlumTree, uPortal), EMS compares a unique variable passed from the network or portal, such as an email address or employee ID, to information on user records and automatically logs authorized users into the program when they double-click the EMS icon.

### Integrated Windows Authentication

Integrated Windows Authentication provides single sign-on for users who have already logged on to their Windows network and have been authenticated by Windows Active Directory.
